APA Ohio is a statewide, non-profit 501(c)(3) association of citizen and professional planners committed to promoting and enhancing planning and the quality of planning for all governmental entities in order to maintain and improve the quality of life for all Ohioans. APA Ohio is a state chapter of the American Planning Association (APA) and is in the top third grouping of largest chapters (based on membership).

Sections

APA Ohio is comprised of five geographic sections. Sections coordinate and sponsor various activities and programs along with partnering with the Chapter to host state-wide conferences. Sections are well known for hosting their annual planning and zoning workshops.



Board of Trustees

APA Ohio operates under the guidance of a Board of Trustees elected from the general membership and sections. Board members are volunteers who donate time and effort to help further planning in Ohio communities. The Board of Trustees is comprised of:

- **5** APA Ohio section directors or their reps
- **3** university reps from CSU, OSU and UC
- **1** executive director (non voting)

Invited guest speakers from organizations including Greater Ohio Policy Center and the Ohio Department of Development to Board meetings to advance policy discussions and expand APA Ohio's influence across the state. Implemented a plan for regular updates to the communication strategy to keep the APA Ohio "planning story" relevant. This means timely eNews updates, relevant social media posts, and print pieces like this report and our quarterly newsletter that reinforce key messages and our policy platform.



Developed strategies to ensure local events and annual conferences continue to be effective and deliver value for members despite the ongoing pandemic. Started involving policy programming at local and chapter events, and in regular chapter communications. Worked diligently on the update to the Guide to Planning in Ohio.



Worked with Sections and Universities to grow a student awards program to showcase exceptional students in planning schools.

Maintained communication and engagement with APA National. Built a strong partnership with the APA Policy & Advocacy staff to ensure timely action in response to key federal planning policy issues.



Developed a "checkin" schedule with Ohio University representatives and Planning Student Organization (PSO) leadership to understand needs and deliver information to keep students engaged with our organization.

Formulated a method to touch base with our Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion goals as it relates to our work plans and committee work.

Continued to grow partnerships with organizations like Greater Ohio Policy Center and the Ohio Economic Development Association to recruit potential members and maximize impact on legislative priorities.
